<p>Elder Charles Hoskins preached “The Place Called Baal-Perazim” using I Chronicles 14:2-11. <i>Baal-Perazim</i> means “the place of breaking through.” There is a place of breaking through in God’s house. God established David to be king of Israel. Just as David had once tended sheep as a shepherd boy, now he would lead Israel. David was tested by experiences just like we are. But God always puts us in the right place. When the Philistines heard that David was king they secretly planned to get rid of him. David discerned that his was happening. We need to be awake and be prepared. The devil seeks for those he can destroy. The enemy was coming so David inquired of the Lord what he should do. We always need to go to God when we have problems. In Him is a place for anything we need. He is our strong tower, our shield and our refuge. <i>Baal-Perazim</i> was the place where God destroyed David’s enemies – a place of breaking through.</p>	<p>Associate Pastor David Harris preached “Will The Real Apostolics Stand Up?” Cast all your care on Jesus for He cares for you. “Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour” (1 Peter 5:8). The devil wants all of us to fall into his trap. There will be seducing spirits in the end time that will cause men to fall away from God. We must keep going and not turn back for Jesus is coming. <i>Will the real Apostolics stand up?</i> God has given us the revelation of the Apostolic doctrine. We must stand on it. Walk and talk with Jesus every day. When’s the last time you spoke in tongues? Our cry should be “Jesus, do not pass me by. I need you.” Like a tug of war the devil would like to take whole families out of church. We can have power over any spirit the devil may throw at us. Any of us who does not love Jesus is not going to make it. If we love Him with all our hearts, we will succeed. Take up the cross and follow Jesus.</p>	<p>Elder Lorren Godwin preached on the topic of “Unity.” He read from II Kings 5:15-17. We have to work together. Don’t be jealous or angry with one another. If our heart is not right, if we don’t worship, we might be contributing to a situation bringing harm to someone besides ourselves. There are a lot of things the world is trying to give us that are tainted, e.g.: friends, music, emotions, video games, TV. Such can change our way of thinking, including how we think of God. We are called by God to be the light of the world. We are in the world, but not of the world. Be careful of how the world influences you. Don’t allow bad things into your mind. We have to be in the world, but the world does not have to be in us. Just having a holy-looking outward appearance is not enough. God can see your inner man—your spirit—even when you may have fooled everyone else. Put Jesus Christ first in everything you do! He will see you through.</p>

The Garden Tomb site is believed by many Christians to be the place where Jesus' body was laid. It is near a hill in which can be seen a face of a skull, believed to be the "Golgotha" of the Bible. When we prayed and worshipped the Lord at this locale, we felt great anointing of the Holy Ghost and had a witness in the Spirit. We felt no such things at the "Church of the Holy Sepulcher" (see photos at right and below).



Many pagan images and themes have been woven into the fabric and design of catholic and orthodox cathedrals and doctrine. The above photo is but a small part of the abundant evidence of the sun-god worship theme present in the "Church of the Holy Sepulcher" in Jerusalem (and other sites as well). We disagree with the catholic/orthodox stance on where the tomb of Jesus is located. See photo at left.



They can and did make some beautiful buildings, which are worth viewing for their architectural value alone. Here you can see some of the beautiful Corinthian-style columns found outside the "Church of the Holy Sepulcher" in Jerusalem. The physical darkness inside such buildings hints at the spiritual darkness of the people who adhere to the catholic/orthodox doctrines and practices. Only after one's eyes adjust to the darkness can one see inside these buildings. When exiting, Pastor Joseph said, "I know it's just a metaphor, but leaving there is like walking from darkness into light!"



The Romans, who conquered and ruled the area of Israel for a time, built much there. They were phenomenal architects and builders. Much of what they built survives to the present day. Here you see a portion of a Roman aqueduct that still stands in Jerusalem, in an area that is now a market place. Before concrete, the "arch" was the only way to suspend heavy weight without simply raising the ground level with more earth. Romans not only invented concrete, but found a way to make it harden under water, which they used to create a man-made breakwater at Caesarea (not seen here).
