The Lord loves for us to fellowship with Him and each other in sweet communion.</p>	<p>God had spoken to both Pastor Joseph and to Assoc. Pastor David Harris Jr. on the topic “All Power.” Elder Harris preached on this, from Matthew 28:18. Jesus said that all power in heaven and in earth were given to Him. As His body in the earth, we have His power, which gives us great authority in the name of Jesus. We can tell devils to shut up and leave us alone. We have power to control evil spirits. Jesus had all power; He healed many diseases and cast out devils. Men were amazed at his teaching because “His word was with power” (Luke 4:32). In our carnal nature, we have no power over evil, but in Him, our spiritual self does. In Him we have the power to discern spirits, meaning we can know the motives driving those who hurt others and themselves. Jesus could do this “for God was with him” (Acts 10:37). He said, “I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you” (Luke 10:19).</p>	<p>Pastor Joseph taught about the nature of the relationship between the Father and the Son. He began with John 17:1-6 as his text, and he also read several other verses from John and other books. God is a Spirit (John 4:24). And a spirit does not have blood (no flesh or bone, see Luke 24:39). But as a human, Jesus had blood—flesh and bone. And as a man, He related to God in every way, in a very real relationship between God and man, even praying to God. Yet, his humanity is the fleshly tabernacle of God (see Colossians 2:8-9). Thus, His human blood was the blood of the one true God (see Acts 20:28). Jesus is God’s humanity (see 1 Timothy 3:16). Although the Son was not sired/ fathered until the conception in Mary’s womb, the <i>plan</i> for the Son always existed in the mind of God (John 1:1-2). This Plan was called “Logos” (Word) long before being made flesh in Mary’s womb (see John 1:1,14). It was at the conception of Jesus in Mary that the Son came into existence.</p>

Wednesday PM, continued...

God made everything by, through, and for His own Plan, His Logos (John 1:3). In Jesus, the Plan became a man (John 1:14). The word *manifested* (see 1 Timothy 3:16) means “made known.” God made Himself known through the man Jesus Christ. Jesus was completely human, even in soul, will, intellect, and emotions. He brought His human will into subjection unto His Father’s divine will when He prayed “Not my will, but thine be done” (Luke 22:42). When Jesus said, “I and my Father are one”, He did not mean *I am my own Father*. Rather, His teaching was that the Son (human) is *united* with the Father (God). The Scriptural message is clear: *Father* and *Son* refer to one God and the one man in whom God revealed Himself: “For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus” (1 Timothy 2:5). In Jesus, God and man were and are united, as *one*.
