We must push ourselves harder to seek God first. Make Him #1.</p>	<p>Pastor Joseph preached "The God of the Valleys" using I Kings 20. "Big moments" don't create good character, they simply reveal it. God is looking for a people of character. Although Ahab was very carnal, God still helped his army defeat the 32 armies led by Benhadad. But Ahab's lack of character was shown through both trials and victories. At first, Ahab was ordered by Benhadad to give up silver, gold, wives and children. Amazingly, Ahab agreed to this! We should not compromise with the world. All efforts to "appease" only lead to greater and greater demands. After Ahab tried to appease his enemy, Benhadad demanded more. He pushed for Ahab's finest materials possessions. Only then did carnal Ahab decide to stand up to Benhadad. God gave Ahab a victory. Benhadad's counselors then advised him to attack again, because the Israeli "gods" were only strong in the hills and not in the valleys! Because of that audacious claim, God decided to give Ahab a second victory. Then, when Ahab should have executed Benhadad, he made a covenant with him. Amazing! God's judgment was then handed down against Ahab. Woe unto the man who shows mercy when God demands judgment, and who judges when God expects mercy. We ought to stand fast against evil and trust in the name of God. God is not just God of the mountains; He is also God in the valleys! He is strong not only during our good times, but also in the trials as well. Even when you're in a valley, let God fight the battle for you. Ahab's lack of character caused him to be complicit in the wrongful death of Naboth, a man of true character who stood strong against Ahab's evil temptings. Naboth was killed simply because he refused to violate God's laws by selling out his family's land to Ahab. Naboth said to Ahab, "The LORD forbid it me, that I should give the inheritance of my fathers unto thee" (1 Kings 21:3). Materialism with debt is a poor swap for God's true blessings of salvation, holiness, marriage, and precious children reared in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. We must be sold out to Jesus Christ and refuse to sell our holy inheritances.</p>


