Last Sunday AM Elder Lorren Godwin taught using Exodus 3:1. Moses' mother couldn't have her baby killed. He was special. God had a divine plan for his life which was to lead His people out of bondage. Moses was put in a basket and it was laid in the flags by the edge of the river. Pharaoh's daughter found him. Moses had the best of everything. He lived in a palace in Egypt, the most powerful nation. Moses killed an Egyptian who was smiting one of his people. Then Moses went to a desert place in hiding. It doesn't take anything special to find Jesus. Just seek! Seek for the presence of God. Moses realized he was nothing without God. We must put Him first in our lives. Go into a desert place to find Jesus. We can't be satisfied having possessions. Only having Jesus can give us real satisfaction. In the desert place Moses saw the presence of God in a burning bush. We need to go to the desert place and find the burning bush (the presence of God).

Sunday PM Associate Pastor David Harris preached "Sealed With A Promise" using Romans 4:17-21. When God promises you something it will come to pass. He doesn't forget His promises. God promised Abraham that he would be the father of many children. Yet Abraham was an old man and still no children. But Abraham staggered not at the promises of God. He was strong in faith. He was fully persuaded that what God had promised He was able also to perform. Jesus said that we would be endued with power from on high, when we receive the Holy Ghost. This promise is for us, our children and to all that God calls. If we have the Holy Ghost, we have the promise. We have the promise of healing, of miracles, of deliverance. What has God promised you? It will come to pass. "And this is the promise that he hath promised us, even eternal life" (I John 2:25). We are going to get to see Jesus. "Ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise" (Ephesians 1:13-14).

Wednesday

Pastor Joseph presented another installment in the series on Relationships, a continuation of Part 4: "Marriage Partnership." Some of the topics covered included: Marriage is a lifelong commitment (Malachi 2:13-16: Mark 10:2-12). It is choosing to love (Genesis 24:67). Couples who succeed in marriage have what researcher John Gottman calls "Emotionally Intelligent Relationships." His advice includes such tips as: Avoid the harsh startup. The first few words out of your mouth can determine how the rest of your conversation. or argument, is going to go. Know how to *slow* down an argument by "repair attempts" which are like stepping on the brakes. There are four bad behaviors that he calls "The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse." They usually ride into the heart of a marriage in this order: First criticism, then contempt, then defensiveness, and, finally, stonewalling. Also covered were: Conflict Resolution and

the Christian Husband.

Water Baptisms Today!

Today at 4:00 pm, here at CAC, will be a water baptismal service for Tommy Smith (seen at right) and his older brother, Bobby Smith. Both of them attend Freedom Apostolic Church, our satellite church in Weston. Please join us for the occasion! Tommy is a student at CAC's Apostolic Christian Academy. He recently received the baptism of the Spirit. In Matthew 28:19, Jesus commanded his disciples, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of



the Son, and of the Holy Ghost." Jesus had opened His disciples' understanding, so that they would understand the Scriptures (see Luke 24:45; note it is the same setting and context as 28:19 of Matthew's Gospel), thus they understood and knew the one name that meets all three of those criteria: Jesus! That explains why the original, first-century church always invoked the name of Jesus over new believers during water baptism. See Acts 2:38, Acts 8:16, Acts 10:48, Acts 19:5, Acts 22:16. Biblical history shows that God has had His salvific name invoked over His people whenever they entered into covenant relationship with Him. New Covenant believers are commanded to be water baptized to become identified with our Lord's death, burial, and resurrection. The proper New Testament way is to invoke the name of the Lord Jesus, the Christ. If you have not yet been water baptized in Jesus name, you can repent and be baptized today! The Word of the Lord promises the outpouring of God's Spirit upon all who obey this command (Acts 2:36-39).
