
Last Sunday AM

He is in control. Jesus is
in the midst. The three
Hebrew children were
thrown into a burning
fiery furnace because
they wouldn't worship
the golden image. When
the king looked he saw
a "fourth man" walking
with them. Jesus was in
their midst. Something
supernatural is going to
see us through the fire
and hard times of this
life. God is in control of
everything. He is
worthy of all our praise.
We need to submit
ourselves more to God.
The most important
relationship we have is
our relationship with
God. He is our refuge,
strength and help in
times of trouble. In the
darkest time there shall
be light. On the Sea of
Galilee in the middle of
a storm Jesus said,
"Peace, be still." Pray,
worship, know, and love
God daily. Jesus is in
our midst.

Sunday PM Evangelist David Bryan preached "I Must" using Mark 8:31. We do not know what it's like to be truly desperate. To Jesus, His ministry was crucial and imperative. The way He did miracles was a must. John 4:4 says, "He must needs go through Samaria." Why? The woman at the well needed Him there. Despite the rejection and pain He suffered on the cross, it was a *must*. We must lift Jesus up today. Salvation is not an option. We must be born again. We must all appear before the judgment seat of God. We must have our mind set that we are going to serve God. I must have the Holy Ghost. I must be born again. Press toward the mark of the prize of the high calling in Jesus. It's necessary; it's imperative. When the Shunammite woman's son died she had to get to the prophet of God, Elisha. He was restored. The woman with an issue of blood pressed herself through the crowd so she could touch the hem of His garment. She was healed. Are you fully persuaded today? We must be of the same mind as Jesus.

Midweek Elder David Harris preached "God Goes Looking For The Outcast" using Matthew 8:3. If we really want to reach a lost and dying world we need to get back to the basics. "Reach the Outcasts." All His life Jesus was with people no one wanted to be around: The lepers weren't allowed in the cities because of their disease; the woman caught in the act of adultery; the tax collectors. Jesus gave His ministry to these kinds of people. He always "showed up" where the outcasts were. Jesus sees all our imperfections and still desires to make something out of us. We are special to Him. We need compassion to reach out to the lowly, outcast people. We have to become like Jesus. No one would touch the woman with an issue of blood, because she was unclean, and no doctor could heal her. But then she touched Jesus and she was made whole. We were once outcasts but Jesus found us. Praise God!
