Sunday PM Pastor Joseph preached "Iron Man of Faith" using Genesis 22:1-13. At the time when God called Abram to come out of Ur of the Chaldees, the wickedness of men was terrible upon earth. As it was with Noah much earlier, we don't know how many other men were called in Abram's day, but we know of Abram only because he answered God's call. God eventually changed Abram's name to Abraham. This man loved his wife, Sarah, even though she was barren. God promised Abraham that through his seed all the families of the earth would be blessed. God brought laughter to Abraham and Sarah's life by giving them their promised son. God told them to name the boy Isaac, which means *laughter*. Through Abraham's seed (a prophetic reference to Jesus) laughter was brought to human families everywhere. When God told Abraham to sacrifice Isaac, He never meant for him to go through with it. He was testing and proving him. Abraham was shown a vision of Mt. Moriah. It was nothing then, but one day it would become the place where all the precious, spotless lambs would be sacrificed each year; the place where Solomon's temple would be built. We must be willing to obey even when we don't understand God. Say, "I will obey God. I don't understand this, but God knows all about it." When we face challenges, regardless if God gives us good or bad things. He is a GOOD GOD!

Wednesday PM Pastor Joseph preached "Mary, Did You Know?" using Luke 2:22-35. When the angel came to Mary and spoke to her, she was receptive to the promise of God. She spoke in reception of the prophecy. Later, when Jesus was a newborn, and he was taken to the temple according to custom, an elderly man named Simeon, who was filled with the Spirit, held Jesus in his arms and blessed Him. He declared that he had seen the salvation of God. He prophesied that Jesus would be set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel. He also prophesied something very dreadful to Mary. He said that a sword would pierce Mary's soul, also. That prophecy of gloom was fulfilled when Jesus died on the cross. Although it was gloomy and painful, the prophecy was truth, and Mary didn't disagree or argue the point. Truth is offensive by its very nature. Will you be offended by hearing the truth, or changed by it? Some people hate the men of God because they speak truth. God has given us an ability to hold one another accountable. Some people work so hard to get others to backslide. Ignore their lies and live for God! If you have a problem that is too big for you to fix, go to God. NEVER GIVE UP. If a situation comes up in your life and it doesn't look good, just keep going. Trust God!

# Passing of Sister Nona Freeman

On Saturday evening, December 26, 2009 at 10:45 PM, a treasure was called home. Sister Nona Freeman, veteran missionary to Africa and one of the best-loved writers in Pentecost, passed from this life peacefully at home with her family at the age of 93.

Sister Freeman and her husband, Rev, E. L. (Bug) Freeman, began their life in missions work in 1948 in South Africa. They left the United States with their five children ranging in ages from nine years to six months, and spent the next forty-one years in Africa.

Even after Brother Freeman's death in 1999, Sister Freeman continued to travel, preach and speak. She served the Lord in ministry for seventy years and has touched thousands of lives. Only eternity will truly know the farreaching impact this great lady had.
