Last Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached "The Master of Change" using Hebrews 11:1-2, 23-29 & John 2:1-11. Although God Himself never changes, He changes many things for us and even changes us. People often misunderstand faith. Sometimes they expect *things* to change when it is *us* that He is changing. It is easy to be stress free while we think we have it all figured out, but it takes faith in God to be free from stress even when you don't know how it could possibly work out. Have faith in God! Think about the lilies. They don't worry about how they are going to be sustained. God takes care of them, and their raiment is beautiful. The Bible says God even cares about sparrows, and that we are more important than they are. Trust God to supply your needs! Don't stress about the turmoil this world is in. No one can't take away your relationship with God. When things change, trust God. Faith is *not* "understanding" what God is doing. Faith is trusting Him that everything will work out to our good. Although Jesus told His mother at the wedding in Cana that "mine hour is not yet come," she still told the servants to do whatever He would tell them to do. She deposited faith into His hands. He turned water into wine. Trust Him in all, thus you deposit faith into His hands.

Elder David Harris Jr. preached "Who Is On The Lord's Side?" using II Kings 9: 32-37. Jehu was a mighty warrior for the Lord. As he approached the castle of Jezebel, that wicked, murderous queen that had a seducing spirit, Jehu called out, "Who is on my side?" Some eunuchs came to the window and declared themselves. He told them to throw Jezebel down, and they did. It's time to stand up and declare whose side you are on. It's time to try the spirits and the people that affect you, and get them to reveal whose side they are on. As Christians we are not supposed to be physically violent in fighting for the Lord, but we are supposed to be spiritually violent in fighting against evil spirits, seducing spirits, and deceiving spirits. Samson, when he was walking right, fought for the Lord. He slew the enemies of God's truth. Nehemiah was like a pastor, holding a construction tool in one hand, and a weapon (sword) in the other. We must not be distracted away from the great work we are called to do. At the same time we must be on guard so that attacks cannot stop us from being able to work. Prior to John the Revelator being exiled on the island of Patmos, wicked people had attempted to kill him by boiling him in oil. However, he did not die. Although he surely suffered much, he knew his strength was in worshipping and praising the name of God.

Pastor Joseph preached "Catch For Us The Little Foxes" using Song of Solomon 2:8-17. In this biblical love story, the groom symbolizes both God and a godly husband. The bride symbolizes both the church and a godly wife. The whole creation has a curse on it because of Adam's sin. Because of the curse, "foxes" spoil the vineyard. This can represent issues that take away from our love relationship to the Lord and/or to our spouse. With great love, the Lord calls to us, asking us to catch the little foxes. We also call to Him for help on issues too big for us to handle on our own; they are all just little foxes to Him. One day He will roll away the curse. In the meantime, don't let addiction rule your life. Love is the reason. "My beloved is mine, and I am his."
