Last Sunday 2:00 PM (Day after Christmas; we had one service.)	Wednesday Evening (December 29, 2010)
<p>Pastor Joseph preached “Rooted and Grounded in Love” using Ephesians 3:14-21. The whole family of God is called by the name of Jesus. If we wish to treat the Lord with love and respect, we must do so by treating each other with love and respect, for we are the body of Christ. In some sense, each one of us is like a tree, and we require strong roots. Yet in another sense, we are also like the soil in which our roots gain nourishment. One Bible verse calls us “trees of righteousness, the planting of the Lord.” Yet another Bible passage, one of the parables of Jesus, described the Word of God as seed that is sown in soil, and the hearts of men are the soil. Jesus described four different kinds of soil. We ought to strive to be the good soil, so we can be well rooted and grounded in love. We must also be rooted and grounded in truth as well as love. People who look for excuses not to live holy or not to come to church are not rooted in love. People who have their mind made up that they are going to live for God—no matter how big any trial may become—are better rooted. People who truly love God’s law have great peace, and nothing shall offend them because they are rooted and grounded in love. We, the Gentiles, were once not a people in God’s Kingdom. We were utterly unworthy. Yet now, through the mercies of God, we are part of His Kingdom, and we have bold access to His throne because of the blood of Jesus. We can overcome any obstacle by being strengthened in the inward man. We ought to not allow any offense to cause us to give up our precious privilege of bold access and our essential, crucial privilege of attending church. Spiritually speaking, where are you? You can be sheltered from any storm under God’s wing. It does not mean there will be no storm, but you can withstand it. You can comprehend with all saints the matchless love of Christ. Be strong in love, so that nothing anyone says or does will be able to make you give up your access through the blood of Jesus.</p>	<p>This was CAC’s very last service of 2010. Pastor Joseph preached “Reviving Hope” from II Kings chapter 4. He first read and spoke from the passage about Elisha and the widow’s oil (vv. 1-7) and then he read and preached from the passage about Elisha and the Shunammite woman whose dead son was raised (vv. 8-37). We don’t have to bury our hopes in despair. By faith we can see hope revived, just like the dead son was raised! We had communion and also a wonderful foot-washing ceremony at the conclusion of the service, and the presence of the Lord blessed powerfully. If anyone thinks they are too good to wash their fellow believer’s feet, or too grossed out to wash feet, he or she needs to read the words of Jesus, in which He commanded all true disciples to follow His example of footwashing. Our Lord, the great creator of the universe, who is higher and mightier than all, bowed Himself in humility and washed the disciples’ feet. He then spoke a command for us to do likewise.</p>

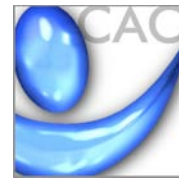

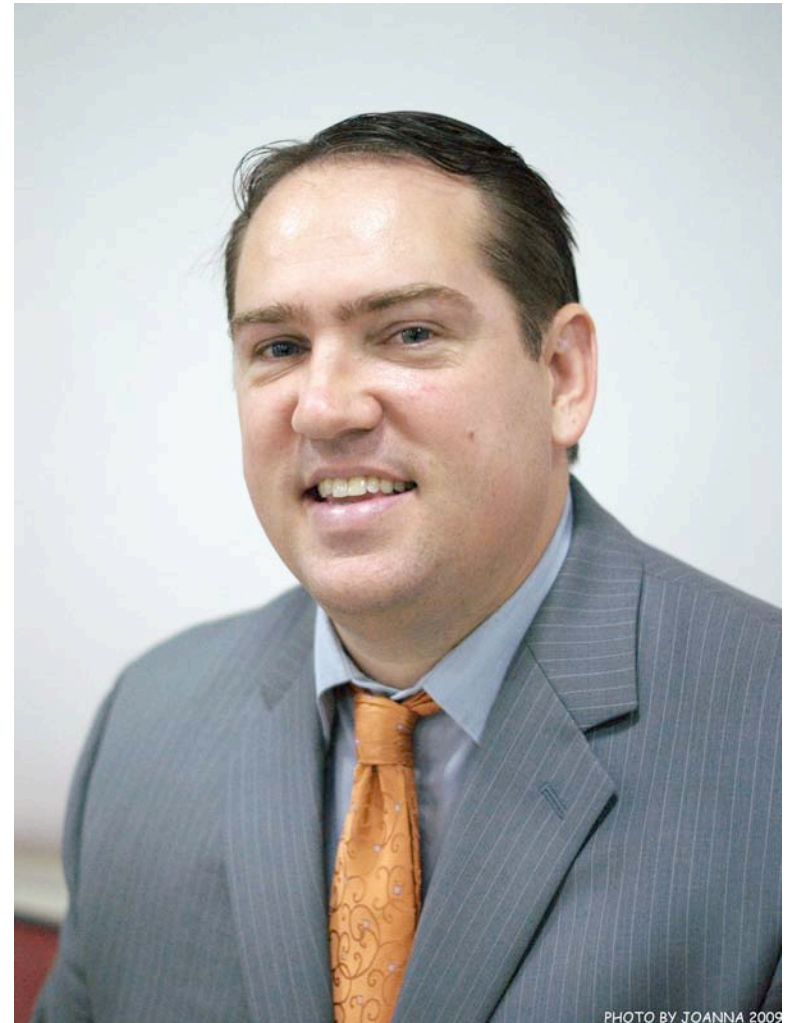
