<p>Pastor Joseph preached “Where the Desert Meets the Mountain” using Exodus 19:1-2. If you allow your carnal nature to have control, you will sin and die. We must be led by the Bible, the Holy Ghost, and godly people. The Lord went out of His way to cause the people to respect Moses and follow him. God could have spoken directly to the people, but He spoke to Moses instead, for him to relay direction to the people. Some people may claim that they don’t need a pastor, but God has called men to lead His people just as He called Moses. Before Moses was called by God, he led sheep in the wilderness, looking for fertile pasture. God saw his care of animals and knew he could also love people as a leader. Take comfort!</p>	<p>In conjunction with January being the Sanctity of Human Life Month, and in anticipation of today being the Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, Pastor Joseph gave a pro-life message entitled “What Shall Be.” He used Luke 1:5-17, which tells the words of the angel, Gabriel, who spoke a detailed prophecy about John the Baptist <i>before his conception</i>. Gabriel used the words “shall” and “shalt” nine times in only five verses. While abortionists obsess on their claims that a pre-born baby “is not” a human person at the time of the murder, God not only knows that the pre-born is a person, He also knows every baby’s entire potential —<i>what shall be</i>. John the Baptist was filled with the Holy Ghost from his mother’s womb, and both he (in a preborn state) and his mother rejoiced at Mary’s salutation. 

**I PRAY** for a day when every human life, born and pre-born, is respected and valued.

**I PRAY** that the strong will stand up to protect the weak and innocent.

**I PRAY** that positive, life-affirming solutions will be found for life's difficult situations.

**I PRAY** that every member of the human family is recognized as one who bears the image of God.

In 1973, two decisions handed down by the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion in all 50 states through all nine months of pregnancy. This damaged the basic foundation of life. The aftermath of January 22, 1973, is not a story of compassion and courage, but one of apathy. Abortion is about a mother facing a difficult decision. It is about how we as family members, neighbors, and communities respond to women facing untimely pregnancies. How are we responding to children of God, image-bearers of the Almighty? Are we doing all we can to help mothers in need?

In Matthew 25, Jesus provided an example of we should care for others:

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me'" (Matthew 25:35-40 NIV).

As Christians who value the sanctity of human life, we pray that our nation can become a culture of life—that positive, life-affirming solutions will be found for difficult situations; that as families, neighbors, and communities, we will respond to women facing untimely pregnancies with love and encouragement. It is our privilege to reach out to those in need and to work for the day when all God's children are welcomed in life and protected in law.
