Elder Charles Hoskins preached "Principles of Worship" using Matthew 4:1-11. The Lord allows us to be tested to show our true self. We can't eat just bread lest we die. We need to eat meat, i.e. feast on the Word of God. Keep your inward man strong so you can stand and say "it is written." We can approach the King of Kings, and He will help us. When Jesus was born there was much rejoicing. The shepherds and the wise men came and worshipped Him. We must worship, praise and magnify God in good times and in bad times. We must love the Lord with all our heart, all our soul, and all our might. In Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead. We need to know the Word of God before we can worship. Pastor Joseph preached "What Shall We Do?" using Acts 2:1-6, 14, 22-24, 36-40. As the multitude was pricked in their hearts on the day of Pentecost, we need conviction today. The church always needs repentance. We must live a lifestyle of confessing and forsaking sin. Some people misunderstand the Scriptures, thinking that if they ever commit a sin after their water baptism then they will forever be lost. So they delay water baptism until as close as possible to death by old age. That is a mistake. The truth is that if we sin after our baptism, then if we will confess and forsake that sin, God will forgive us. True repentance will make our earlier water baptism (even if done many years before) as fresh as the moment we stepped out of the water. "If any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (I John 2:1). "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:7-9).

Wednesday

Pastor Joseph preached using I Timothy 3:1 & Hebrews 13:1, 5-9, and 13-17. God's Word allows some flexibility in church government, yet clearly only God can call someone into the fivefold ministry. God-called pastors can either be appointed by a senior minister or by a church election. An electing church has a responsibility to seek God about the office and wisely vote affirmation to the will of God. It is a good thing to desire to office of bishop (i.e. pastor). A pastor must not be one who craves status or power. He must have a burden for the work of God. Jesus was the Lord God Almighty but He humbled himself and washed His disciples' feet. We ought to humble ourselves and help our brethren in any way possible. The smallest to biggest job in the church is doing service to the King.

Sis. Claypool's foot is broken in the worst way: a calcaneus fracture. Unless God grants her a miracle, she will be unable to put any weight on her foot for a period of months. She has no insurance. She is going to miss school classes and work, *without pay*. Her finances are extremely limited. Her fall was caused by crumbling steps at the courthouse in Grafton. She has been encouraged to obtain a lawyer. Even if she is ever able to get a court judgment awarding her money to repay medical bills and recoup lost income, it would take a long time to obtain it. Regardless, she needs the help of her church, in every way (physical help, prayer support, & financial help). She now has a serious fracture *blister*, a rare complication that is problematic. If doctors



decide to do surgery, they must wait until the fracture blister goes away.

What is a calcaneus fracture? The calcaneus is the bone in the back of the foot, commonly referred to as the heel bone. This bone helps support the foot and is important in normal walking motions. The joint on top of the calcaneus is responsible for allowing the foot to rotate inwards and outwards.

How does a calcaneus fracture occur? Calcaneus fractures are almost always the result of high-energy injuries. They usually occur as a result of a fall from a height, such as falling from a ladder. Other causes of a calcaneus fracture include automobile accidents and sports injuries. The calcaneus can also sustain a stress fracture, an injury sometimes seen in athletes, such as long-distance runners. Stress fractures are a different type of injury from a traumatic fracture. Hers was the traumatic kind.

What are the symptoms & complications of a calcaneus fracture? Calcaneus fractures cause significant swelling and pain of the back of the foot. Symptoms of a calcaneus fracture include: inability to walk, swelling of the foot, bruising of the foot, severe heel pain. Most calcaneus fractures are closed injuries, meaning the skin is intact. When the skin around the calcaneus fracture is broken, this may represent an open fracture, also called a compound fracture. An open fracture of the calcaneus is a surgical emergency.

Calcaneus fractures are generally quite severe injuries, and often lead to longstanding problems of the foot and ankle. The complications of calcaneus fractures can be separated into early and late complications.

Early complications of calcaneus fractures are most often due to the significant swelling that can occur with these injuries. Those patients who have surgery for a calcaneus fracture can develop healing problems as a result of this swelling. As mentioned, patients with diabetes, smokers, and those with poor circulation are especially prone to developing this complication.

Late complications from a calcaneus fracture are most often due to chronic foot pain and arthritis. Arthritis of the hindfoot is common after a patient sustains a calcaneus fracture. The risk of developing arthritis as a result of the calcaneus fracture is generally related to the severity of the fracture. Patients often have problems with chronic foot pain, difficulty with certain types of footwear, and pain associated with walking, running, and prolonged standing.
