Pastor Joseph preached "Lessons Learned from Noble Romans, Part 2" from the tenth chapter of the Book Acts. Cornelius was a Roman centurion, which was a respectable rank. However, he was more than just a soldier. He prayed to God always, and gave alms to the poor. Our identity should be more than a job or career we have in this life. It should ultimately be that we are a servant of God; one who serves and loves God with all our heart. Jacob had a birth-name and identity of being a cheater. He lived "down" to his name until he was determined to change by God's help. Then he wrestled with God (via an angel), and the Lord changed his name and his life. Cornelius was a devout man who feared God. However, he was a Gentile. Even though he had no standing as far as salvation was concerned, the Lord revealed to the Apostle Peter that God is no respecter of persons. What God calls clean, don't call unclean. Peter preached to Cornelius' household, and the Holy Ghost fell on them all. If we love God and want to serve Him, He will make a way. God had always planned to allow Gentiles in His kingdom. If we love God, He will accept us no matter what nation we are from.


Wednesday
