Pastor Joseph preached "Doctor Luke" using Hebrews 12:1-2, II Timothy 4:1-11, & Luke 1:1-4. In this sin-cursed world, doctors are needful, but be careful of unbelieving doctors who don't accept God, prayer, miracles, or the fact that we were carefully designed. Luke, the gospel writer and also author of Acts, was a godly doctor. The sin of Adam and Eve caused death and sickness to come into the world, and made everything off balance. Thus, we must be on guard at all times against our carnal nature, or else we can be ensnared. We must lay aside every weight and the sin which doth so easily beset us. Every sin we do causes harm. Even "little sins" that may seem innocent can cause much damage. Many sins are terribly addictive also. Thankfully, Jesus made a way of escape by dying on the cross that we may obtain salvation. Sin has no hold on us if we come to Jesus and walk after the Spirit and not after the flesh. We need to be honest and take responsibility for our own sinful choices. Some commit sins in the dark, thinking no one sees, but God sees and knows all. Every sin, no matter how slight, has consequences. Jesus can help us even when human doctors cannot.

Elder David Harris Jr. preached "We Don't Need Another Masterpiece, Just a Piece of the Master" using Matthew 9:20-21, Matthew 14:36 & Mark 5:27-32. The woman diseased with an issue of blood knew if she could just touch the hem of Jesus' garment she would be made whole. When Jesus went into the land of Gennesaret many who were diseased besought him that they might touch the hem of his garment. He healed people everywhere He went. God has let us be in poor circumstances, but He has given us faith to believe and gifts to change our situations. God has even given us dreams with answers. If we could just get a piece of the master, we would find faith to get our miracle. We serve a masterful, powerful God. We serve a God who is able to do anything.

Wednesday

Pastor Joseph preached "Coulda, Woulda, Shoulda" using Romans 8:1, 13-14, 18-25, 28-31, & 38-39. While sins before coming to God can often be ignored in God's work, sins after conversion are not so easily ignored. "Judgment must begin at the house of God" (I Peter 4:17). Two examples: 1. David desired to build a temple for the Lord, but God refused him, because of his past as one who shed blood. 2. In the Church Age, any man desiring to be in leadership may not serve if he practices polygamy. If one is trying to live for God in his own strength, his addictions and lusts will often lead to a frustrating cycle of sinning, repenting, and sinning again. That cycle is harmful. It is important to recognize that God can help us break such a cycle. There is hope! There is real freedom in Jesus. Because of this, it is possible to fall upon His mercy instead of His judgment—but only if we are willing to truly repent and we're desperate to be free from sin. If we walk after the flesh we will die. Walk after the Spirit!

Fun! Kiddie Corner Jesus Heals 10 Men from Leprosy, Luke 17


Remember to Say Thanks!
