## Last Sunday AM

Elder Charles Hoskins preached using Job 22:21-30. We need to listen to God in order to receive from Him. We must acquaint ourselves with God. When we are acquainted with Him, we don't just know Him but we strive to know more about Him. Let us set our mind on things above, not earthly things. Lay up His words in our heart. We understand more as we grow in God's Word. We need to humble ourselves. Sometimes we get caught up in things of the world and try to handle them ourselves. Then we really mess things up. We just need to turn it over to God. When God makes us a promise, we can rest assured that He will keep it. He doesn't lie. God leads us in the right direction to pray. We must not imitate the customs, fashions, or values of this world but be transformed by the renewing of our mind. Fix your mind on good things. Our thoughts can always be pure if we look through the eyes of Jesus. We can have the ability to control our thoughts. Let us think on things that are excellent and worthy of praise. We are to think differently from the world because we are aliens and strangers in this world. We must live, walk, talk, dress and think differently—in the world but not part of it. We must be holy on the inside as well as the outside. We must wear spiritual clothes such as love. Whatever we do, we must do it as a representative of Jesus Christ. We must not walk as worldly people who have no sense of shame. We must put on the whole armor of God, not just part of it. Then we will be able to stand in this world as a godly person.

Elder David Harris Jr. preached "The God of Ancient Times" using Isaiah 45:21-22. Everyone has a different style. God can change our style, but God never changes. He's the same yesterday, today and forever. The preachers and prophets of old were moved on by God and many miraculous things happened. God defended the city of Jerusalem. 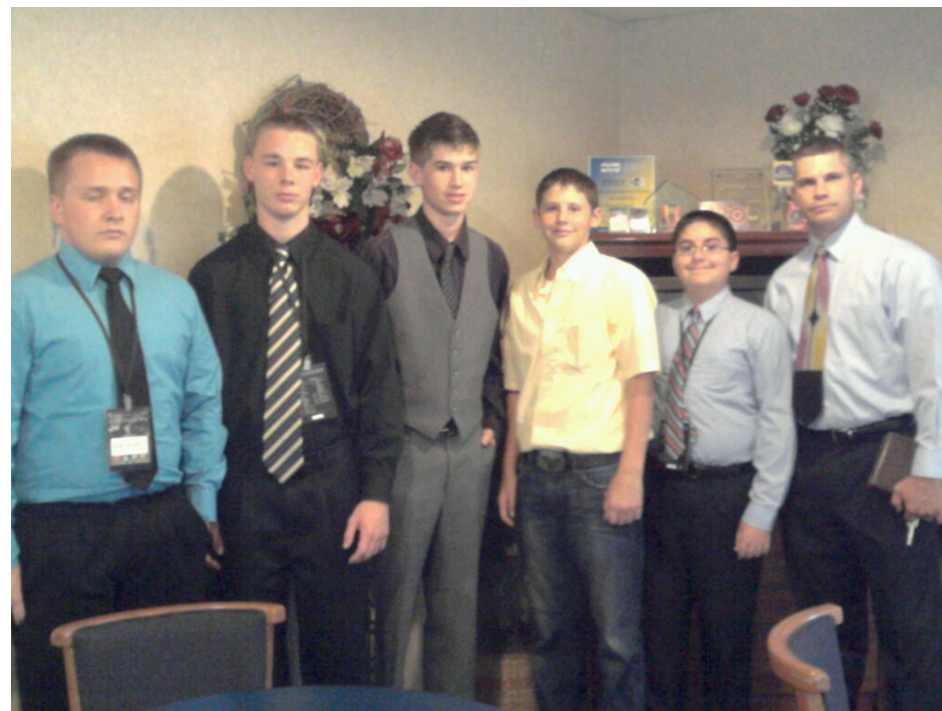
