Elder David Harris Jr. preached "What Garment Are You Wearing?" using Mark 10:46-50. Blind Bartimaeus wore a garment that distinguished him as being a blind beggar. When Jesus called to him, he took off that garment, by faith that he was going to be healed. He never wore that garment again. Spiritually, people wear beggars' garments today. People have "stuff" hanging on them such as sin, lust, disease, addictions, vanity, financial attacks, spiritual attacks, pride, anger, depression, fear, insecurity and jealousy. We need to come to Jesus and cast all this stuff off. He died on the cross to give us total freedom. Repent! Stay clean. In Matthew 22:11, Jesus asked a man why he had come to the wedding without the right garment on. Many are weighed down by sins and things of this world. No sin will enter Heaven. We must be a new creature. Cast off sins. God will give us a new garment. He can rid us of our past, our hurts, sins, problems and fears. Don't let anything that doesn't belong attach itself to your garment.
