Sunday PM

Pastor Joseph preached "The Praise of God" using Genesis 33 as his text. "Ziggurats" were towers built by ancient Mesopotamian races for their false religions. Each ziggurat was part of a temple complex which included other buildings. Ziggurats were not places for public worship or ceremonies. They were believed to be dwelling places for the gods and each city had its own patron god. Only priests were permitted on the ziggurat or in the rooms at its base, and it was their responsibility to "care for the gods and attend to their needs." The priests were very powerful members of Sumerian society. Long before man was made, Lucifer wanted the praise of his peers more than he wanted the praise of God. He decided he did not need God and did not care about God's judgment." In craving the approval of the other angels, he effectively built a spiritual ziggurat, and it brought swift judgment from God. Much later, in our human history, the people at Babel built a tower (seemingly a type of pre-cursor to the ziggurats that came later). Their tower must have reminded God of Satan's "I will ascend" rebellion. The tower at Babel brought God's swift judgment. They, like Satan, felt they did not need God and did not care about His judgment (i.e. the Flood). Their thought process was 'We'll build so high that we can rebel and His punishment won't affect us!' They wanted the approval of peers more than the approval of God, so God split them up from one another to deny them that human approval they so craved. We don't need to build a ziggurat. We need to build an altar! Satan and those of Babel thought "We don't need God. We can succeed on our own!" That's what their tower meant. Yet an altar says "the way up is down! Except a corn of wheat fall to the ground and die, it abideth alone." An altar is where we die. It's where we acknowledge that our carnal nature is wrong and needs to be judged. Jesus' death on the cross made Mt. Calvary the ultimate altar. Carnal skill, fleshly gifts, human ingenuity, human ideas, human plans, were all decreed by the death of Jesus to be insufficient for salvation.

Associate Pastor David Harris Jr preached "Our God" using Isaiah 53:4-6 as his text. Through robing himself in flesh as Jesus Christ, God gave us a roadmap of how to live. God gave His own human manifestation as a sacrifice for our sins so that we might have life. What a great God we serve! "Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.


