Last Sunday AM - Fifth Sunday Celebration - One service only:

Pastor Joseph preached "Holding to the Right Side" using several passages of text from the Book of Acts. The missionary journeys of Paul always resulted in a polarization of the cities and towns where he preached. Those who accepted the gospel were welcomed into the kingdom, but those who rejected the gospel often vehemently fought against truth and assaulted Paul or resorted to legal or political maneuvers to remove him from their area. Likewise today, when we reach for the lost, we will often see division come into families. It is not because God desires division in and of itself, but God rightly insists on separation from this corrupt world. Also, those who reject truth and seek to suppress it will almost always insist on division as well. Whenever division must occur, the most important thing is hold to the right side. Sometimes the church will encounter people who are demon possessed or demonically manipulated or controlled. The biblical record (see the Book of Acts) shows that sometimes the church sets such people free, yet other times the church simply leaves them in their plight. In the worst of cases, the church even declared a curse (such as physical blindness) to accompany the spiritual blindness of the wicked opponents of truth. How can vou decide whether someone should be set free or whether they should be left in their plight? In addition to help from the gifts of the Spirit, such as the discerning of spirits, the word of knowledge, and word of wisdom, there is usually a clear red flag whenever someone opposes the gospel, and seeks to undermine the minister of the gospel, and thereby seek to repress the truth. This reveals that the person is on the wrong side of things with God, and therefore with the church.

Wednesday

Pastor Joseph taught a two-fold lesson about (1) how to reach "Generation Y" and (2) helpful tips about some principles of prophecy. He used Daniel 4:1-3 and Joel 2:1-15 as his main texts. Much good can be said of the generation of youths born between 1982 and 2001, labeled variously as Generation Y, the Millennial Generation (or Millennials), Generation Next, Net Generation, Echo Boomers. However, there are some negatives to be aware of. Regardless, they are "gapped" from prior generations. They comprise the demographic cohort following Generation X. They have practically never heard a busy signal, and since they grew up with the Internet and many techno gadgets, they cannot imagine a world without such. The traditional nuclear family has almost totally dissolved (there are far fewer families with two parents who are both biologically related to all the children in the home). Today's families are smaller (so there are fewer children vying for parental attention). GenY's often have not had to learn to share. Due to popular media shows, texting, and due to this being the "Google age", the youth of Generation Y have shorter attention spans, conversational illiteracy, and weaknesses in the areas of research and study. They loathe being told how or when to do a thing, preferring to be simply told when it is due to be

completed, and then being permitted to work out the how (often using Google) and the when on their own. They view time differently than prior generations, seeing each 24 hour period as a resource to be divvied up for use in any way they see fit. They are easily offended online and/or easily seduced online. Regarding morals they may take the pluralistic view-that no person or religion has the authority to tell anyone else what is absolutely right or wrong for them. Relativism taken to the extreme means they have little or no shame, guilt or remorse over sins such as fornication (even including homosexuality) or atheism. They do not live as though they will answer to God for their choices, and they are raised (in large part) to be ignorant of this fact. However, the Bible's teachings from prophecy reveal that God's kingdom has dominion over every generation, and that the Day of the Lord (in Hebrew: "Yom Yahweh" aka "Yom Jehovah") is coming, as a terrible time of God's judgment upon the wickedness of men. This generation may be harder to reach than others, but we are obligated to reach them, and God will help us. They may think that teaching or declaring the coming judgment of God is meanness or a lack of compassion, but the opposite is true. We must tell it because we care! Following is a quote from an article on Wikipedia about the youth of Generation Y (emphasis added): "Each generation has its archetypes, the four having the following one defined as: Prophet, Nomad, Hero, and Artist... Millennials belong to the Hero category. featuring a deep trust in authority and institutions; being somewhat conventional, but still powerful. They grew up during an Unraveling cycle with more protections than the previous generation (Gen X). They are heavily dependent on team work, and thus, when they come of age, turn into the heroic team-working young people of a Crisis. In their middle years, they become the energetic, decisive, and strong leaders of a High cycle; and in old age, they become the criticized powerful elders of an Awakening cycle. Another previous generation that belongs to this category is The Greatest Generation (1916–1924).
