Last Sunday AM - Easter

Brother David McKemy preached "The Masterpiece" using Mark 6:3 as a main part of his selected texts. What makes a work of art into a masterpiece? All paintings have paint on canvas. All the painters use brushes. Even some of the masters rendered paintings that were not considered masterpieces. The difference is in the inspiration. The inspiration of God poured into and through the man Christ Jesus wrought the greatest masterpiece in all history: Calvary. Jesus was raised by Joseph the carpenter, so He was no doubt skillful with the tools of the human father-figure who raised him. In Mark 6:3 the people said of Jesus, "Isn't this the carpenter?" Obviously he had taken up something of Joseph's skills and abilities. That being the case, it seems obvious that Jesus was no wimp. A carpenter of that day had to be both lumberjack, lumber mill[er], carpenter, and finisher. Jesus was no doubt a very strong man with calloused, powerful hands. The final act of a carpenter in creating a masterpiece of furniture was to stain or seal the wood, so the piece would last for generations. When it came to the wood of the old, rugged cross, no linseed oil sealer would do. Because the Church was to last forever, He sealed the wood of this masterpiece with His own blood! He painted the greatest masterpiece using His precious blood as the paint, and all time as His canvas.

Last Sunday PM - Easter

Brother David McKemy preached about miracles, using Mark 2:1-5 for his text. He told amazing testimonies that sparked our faith to believe for great things from God. Bro. McKemy explained that in 1995 he was found to have terminal pancreatic cancer. He was referred from one hospital to another until he finally was admitted to the Mayo Clinic, the best hospital in the world for dealing with this sever, incurable disease. Their scans clearly revealed the tumors. The Mayo Clinic doctor stated firmly that Bro. McKemy had only a few weeks to live, and if he underwent a drastic surgery to split his pancreas open and carve out the tumors, his life would be extended by only a couple of months at best. Bro. McKemy boldly testified to the Mayo Clinic doctor that God was going to heal. God subsequently used Bro. McKemy to preach to others, and they were healed, while he was not. Eventually, his pain grew so intense he could no longer preach. Then, in his immense pain, a pastor insisted that he preach. He did, and God healed him. When he returned to Mayo Clinic at the time of the surgery, additional scans revealed all the tumors were gone. The doctor could not explain it. He was reluctant to believe, and he insisted that Bro. McKemy would die within weeks if he did not have the surgery. Bro. McKemy refused, and he is currently alive and well. He has preached all around the world.

Last Wednesday

Bro. Baron Claypool brought forth a wonderful word from the Lord about how that we were all strangers and aliens with regard to the Kingdom of God, but now the Lord has engrafted us into the Kingdom and we are citizens and no more strangers. This was not due to any great deeds or worth on our part, but because of God's great love for us. Elder Godwin preached a great message from I Samuel 30:6, where David and his men (while living in exile after David fled from Saul) had been to a

battle, and when they returned all their possessions had been stolen, their wives and children taken, and their houses burned. When they discovered this, in despair they spoke of stoning David, their leader. But David encouraged himself in the Lord his God. The original Hebrew word for "encouraged" means "to fasten upon"—David clung to God. He attached himself to God. He essentially got alone with God and worshipped God. In doing so, he reminded himself of God's call and anointing. Too many Christians, when facing adversity, run and hide even after all God has done for us. God wants us to step out in faith and worship Him in advance of receiving our miracle. If we trust God in bad times as well as in good times, He'll do great things!


