Elder Les Benedum preached "Where is Jesus" from Matthew 14:24-33. Peter had complete trust in Jesus when he stepped out of the boat in the midst of a storm and began walking. It wasn't until he took his eyes off Jesus and saw the wind boisterous that he became fearful and began to sink. This was a real storm, not just a little rain. When God tells you to do something, trust Him and be obedient. When you call out to God in your storm, He will immediately come to you. The storm did not cease until Jesus and Peter came into the ship. Jesus is with you in your storm. Don't doubt the power of God. When Paul was in the shipwreck, he was given a word of faith to speak to the people. You need to speak encouraging words. You don't know what someone is going through or who needs a word from God. Be an encourager. Help someone through a storm.

Metro Missionary Justin Meadors preached a powerful message, "All Bottled Up," from Genesis 21:14-20. When Abraham sent away Hagar and her son, he gave them only a loaf of bread and a bottle of water. They faced a journey through the wilderness to find shelter and a life. They had no one to call upon—no church, family, or friends. When the water was spent, there was nowhere to refill it in the desert. With her son (then about 14 or more years old) crying for thirst, she felt that she couldn't bear to watch him die. With tears of desperation she stationed the boy under some shade and then left him alone to die. She thought it was the end of the line, but then she called upon God for herself. There are trials and tests you must go through in which the pastor, family, and friends simply can't help. For some things you must go to God in prayer for yourself. You must have a relationship with God. Swallowed by disappointment, Hagar could not depend on man. Then God helped, and she found a well of water! Don't trust in the bottle (man-given limits and opinions). Come to the well of God. He is the way. You can make it!


## Wednesday

## Christmas Trivia: Etymology of "Noel"

"Noel" (formal spelling Noël) is the French word for Christmas. In French, "Merry Christmas" is "Joyeux Noël." Noël is a masculine French given name (the feminine form is Noëlle) which approximates "Christmas." It is derived from the Latin "natalis" (birth) referring to the Nativity of Christ. — Source: http://answers.yahoo.com/ (from info on Wikipedia)

Noel (also spelled Nowell or Noël) ( $n \ni \upsilon'$ sl) is an alternative word for Christmas. It first entered the English language in the  $14^{th}$  century. The word comes from Middle English *noel*, which derives from the Old French word *noël* and its more common form *naël*. The English spelling "Noël" is taken directly from modern French, which also derives from the Old French. The ultimate Latin origin is the phrase  $n\bar{a}t\bar{a}lis$  ( $di\bar{e}s$ ), "(day) of birth." — *Source: http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Noel*
