#### Wednesday

Pastor Joseph preached a Christmas-related message entitled "The Sign of His Coming" from Matthew 12:39, 16:4, 24:3 and other verses. In particular, he led us in an expositional reading of Luke chapters 1 & 2, after expounding about the Bible's doctrine regarding signs. On one hand, Jesus denounced the wicked people that demanded a sign from Him, yet on the other hand, the Bible lists quite a few occasions when believers asked for a sign, and they were suffered to receive explanations, details, and tolerance in their weakness of needing a sign or more information. The Bible's overall message about signs is nuanced in that God takes note of one's attitude, reasoning, and motivation in asking for a sign. It seems that in His consideration, He weighs very differently those who refuse to believe without a sign vs. those who already believe yet struggle to have a better grasp. God also seems to weigh whether one's current level of maturity and knowledge means that he or she ought to be able to trust and understand without additional signs or explanations. In summary, it's not always evil to ask God for a sign, but sometimes it clearly is, and the wicked generation around us is clearly in no position to demand a sign, yet they vehemently do so any way. In Luke 1, Zachariah the priest, who was to become the father of John the Baptist, questioned in doubt when the angel prophesied John's birth, and the angel smote Zachariah with dumbness until after the miracle came to pass. Clearly Zachariah was expected to handle the good news better. One preacher has noted that Zachariah was forced into silence so he would not talk himself out of a miracle! By contrast when Marry, the lowly and humble maid who was to become the mother of the Christ, inquired as to how it could be, she was met with more tolerance. Later, the angel who addressed the lowly shepherds did not even wait for them to ask for a sign or explanation. The angel preempted the question by telling them what their sign was to be: They would find the wrapped newborn laying in a feeding trough. The signs God gives often seem "plain" or mundane, but such is His way! Be thankful you know Jesus, and don't *demand* glorious signs in order to believe!




