Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached "What the Bible Says About Abortion" from Jeremiah 1:4-5. The Bible does not specifically mention the word abortion, but it has a number of significant things to say about preborn children. The preborn is a person, and it is wrong to murder a person, thus, it is wrong to murder a preborn. A preborn has personal attributes such as joy and the sin-curse. In Psalms 51:5, David wrote, "Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin my mother conceived me." And Luke 1:44 says, "For behold, when the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby leaped in my womb for joy." The Bible uses personal pronouns to describe a preborn child. Jesus was a person at the time of conception. Matthew 1:20 shows that the angel told Joseph that "the Child who has been conceived" is "of the Holy Spirit." The preborn are called children. Luke 1:44 states that "the **baby** leaped in her womb." In the Mosaic Law, preborns are protected from murder by the same punishment as for adults. The preborn are called by God before birth. The preborn are known personally by God just like any other person. Since abortion is murdering a person, abortion is morally wrong.

Sunday PM

Pastor Joseph preached "My Part in the Kingdom" from Mark 1:1-8. John the Baptist addressed both himself and the Lord Jesus. In Mark 1:8 he stated, "I indeed have baptized you with water [John addressing his part]; but he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost [John addressing the Lord's part]." We, the church, can reach out to souls like John the Baptist did. God will baptize them with the Holy Ghost. All angels in Heaven rejoice when one soul comes to repentance. All the work we can do—praying, fasting, witnessing, Bible studies, holiness—is worth it if we can reach one soul. Each and every one of us has a part in the Kingdom of God. You may think, "What can I do?" God has a purpose and calling for every one of us. You don't know when someone is watching you. Cheer up a discouraged friend. Be a John the Baptist! Go forth and represent Jesus. Each soul is precious to God.

Wednesday

Ken Ham (via video link) presented a message entitled "Already Gone" regarding how to teach our youth both a biblical worldview, Christian apologetics, and to trust and defend the historicity of Genesis chapters 1-11. Many Christians avoid Genesis 1-11, even though it is the bedrock upon which all of Scripture is based—including the doctrines of sin, death, and salvation. With culture systematically hinting to our children the Bible is a fairytale (with evolution and "millions and billions of years" of supposed evolutionary history presented everywhere from Happy Meal boxes to Disney movies, and from TV cartoons to science textbooks) it is no wonder that most youth raised in churches are not still believers beyond adolescence and into adulthood. It is crucial that we present the biblical truth (the real science, biology, geology, astronomy, anthropology, etc) of the accurate account of *ex nihilo* creation found in Genesis! Don't let Noah's ark be a "tale"!

Solve the puzzle to see what Isaiah 52:7 says.



