Bro. John F. Harrison preached "Christian Weight Loss" from Hebrews 12:1-2. We are surrounded with a great cloud of witnesses; let us lay aside every weight and sin. An excuse is a type of weight. In the garden of Eden God asked Adam if he had eaten of the tree which He had told him not to. Adam could have said, "Yes, Lord, I have sinned and I'm sorry." But Adam excused himself and said, "The woman gave it to me and I did eat." Let us get rid of excuses. They are weights. If you back away from Jesus, there's no place to go. Keep faith in Jesus. Don't draw back (see Hebrews 11). Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. By faith Sarah was delivered of a child past age. By faith Israel was delivered from bondage. Just live by faith! Look unto Jesus! He lived a life without excuses and sin.

Sunday PM

Bro. John F. Harrison taught a six-point lesson about important basics in personal and family finance. The first point was spend less than you earn. The second was to pay yourself (by saving) before paying others you may owe. The proper order of priorities regarding finance is: God first, yourself second, and everyone else third. The third main point was to avoid debt. The Bible says, "The rich ruleth over the poor, and the borrower is servant [slave] to the lender" (Proverbs 22:7). Credit card companies trick people young and old, into thinking that debt is "status" and "cool" and is "access to money," yet a credit card is actually access to debt and therefore slavery. The genius Albert Einstein, who gave the world the theory of relativity and "E=MC²" was once asked, "What is the most powerful thing in the universe?" He answered, "Compound interest." Bro. Harrison remarked, "Those who understand compound interest *earn* it, while those who don't understand *pay* it." Another point in this excellent lesson was: start on your retirement early. Someone who starts young can invest a small amount of money, and because of compound interest, retire wealthy. A person who waits until middle age or worse, must invest a huge amount of money, and still will likely not have enough. Time is needed to let compound interest work its magic. Bro. Harrison recommended owning a home rather than renting, and buying nice used vehicles rather than new. A new vehicle instantly loses 20% of its value the moment it is titled in your name. It is much cheaper to maintain a paid-off car than it is to pay monthly payments.

Wednesday

Elder Zach Sandy preached "Obsessed" from I Kings 11:6 and Job 23:12. We need a strong obsession for God. When you're obsessed with something, it dominates and preoccupies your mind. We need to be obsessed with God, with church, with the Bible, with truth. We will walk, talk, dress and do what God wants. Things of this world will mean nothing to us. We will fully follow after the Lord. Elder Lorren Godwin preached from Nehemiah. When Nehemiah told the people how the walls of Jerusalem were broken down, the people said, "Let us rise

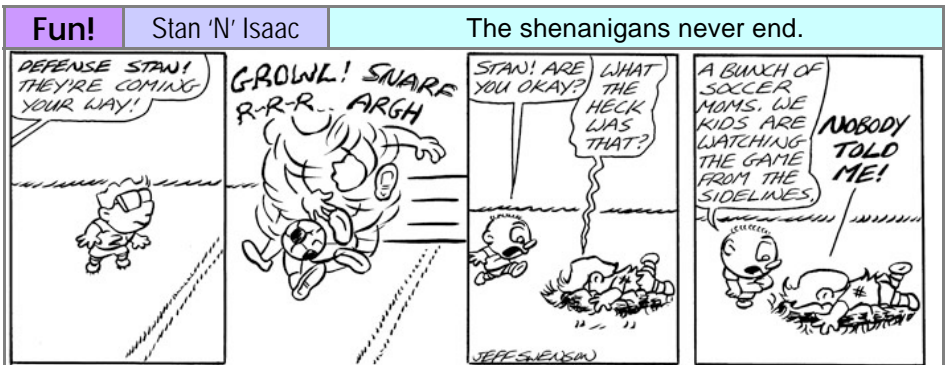
up and build." The people "had a mind to work." Even though they faced abuse and opposition, the walls were rebuilt. We need to work together and not have division among ourselves as a church. "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity" (Psalm 133:1). Let's work together!

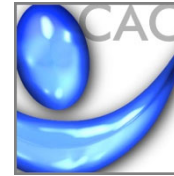
