Elder Lorren Godwin taught on "The Prodigal's Father" from Luke 15:11-20. Based on the parables Jesus told before the parable of the prodigal son (i.e. of a woman who searched diligently for a lost coin and a shepherd who searched until he found a lost lamb), it seems like the father did not wait, but went looking for his son. In another parable a man prepared a great feast and sent his servants to bring the guests in. Each guest had an excuse why they wouldn't come. So the master sent his servants to the highways and byways to compel people to attend. Compel means to strongly urge, almost forcing them. Its root word refers the crook of your curved arm, as though you've wrapped your arm around their shoulders to show them love. We need to love the prodigals and help them find their way home.

Pastor Joseph preached "Looking Unto Jesus" from Hebrews 12:1-3 and I Cor. 9:24-27. This message was a greatly anointed presentation of Jesus and His gospel. Jesus is the author and finisher of our faith. We must look to Him for salvation, truth, help, strength, and healing. By His death, burial, and resurrection, Jesus provided for us a narrow *Gate* for entering into the Kingdom of God, and a narrow *Way* upon which to travel. Entering the Gate refers to being born again. Traveling in the Way refers to a holy life as we seek to make Heaven our home. Once we become born again (by repentance, water baptism in Jesus name, and the infilling of the Holy Ghost) we have passed through the Gate, but we must then travel in the Way. We must stay faithful in running the race that is the Christian lifestyle. If we lose sight of Jesus, we will begin to grow weary, faint, and list into backsliding. If we keep looking unto Him, we will be connected to our source and stay strong unto the end! When discouragement and disappointments come, keep running! When you feel like quitting, keep running! When you don't know which direction to go, keep running! When everything seems to be against you, keep running!

Our younger children enjoyed a tremendous Vacation Bible School all this past week, as they learned about all the attributes of the fruit of the Spirit: In the King James Version of the Bible, the fruit of the Spirit is described as love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance. In the New International Version, the fruit of the Spirit is described as love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. 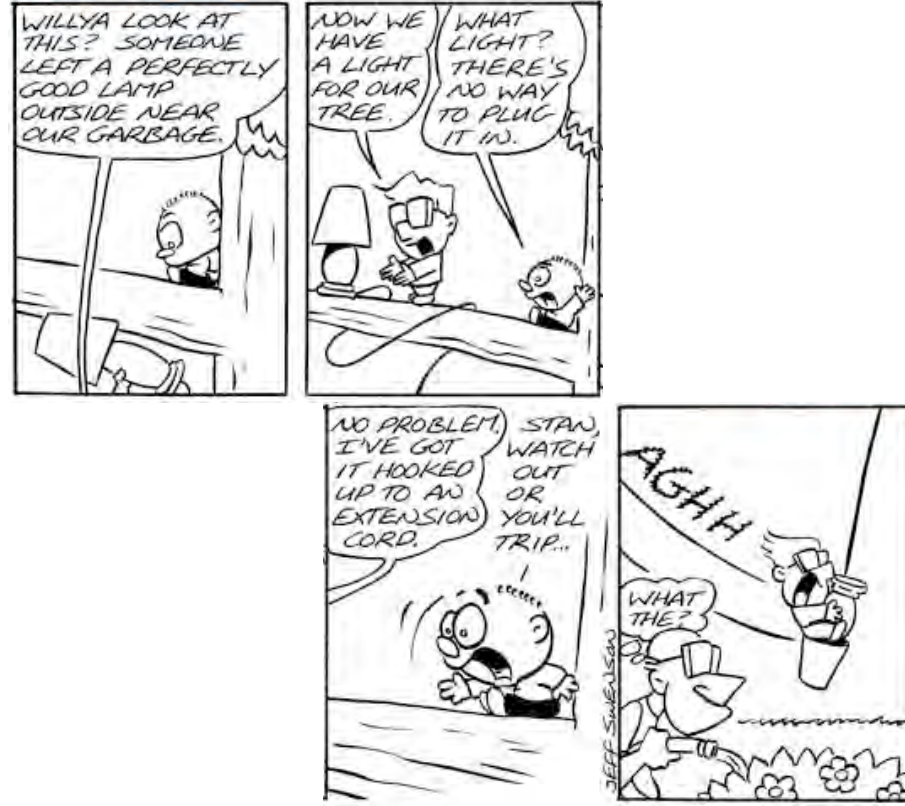
