Pastor Joseph preached "Biblical Principles of Holiness" from I Peter 1:15-16 & Hebrews 12:14-15. We are all commanded to be holy in all aspects of our lifestyle. Christians are to adorn themselves in modest clothing. This is especially at issue for women in this wayward modern culture. Modest clothing means no low-cut necklines, high splits in skirts, or clothes that are tight, see-through, or too short. Men tend to struggle with the lust of their eyes. Although men are responsible for their own actions and attitudes, women should dress modestly. (Woe to those through whom offenses come.) The church needs to speak what the Bible says. We have the Word of God, the Spirit of God and the preaching of the church to lead us. We need to speak the truth in love to help our brothers or sisters. We are not to be conformed to this world. We must be transformed by the renewing of our minds. Holy living involves the body, mind and spirit. Holiness is essential to salvation. It is not a suggestion, but a commandment. The basis of holiness is faith and love (love for God and others), and the power for holiness comes from the Holy Ghost. If you love God, you will keep His commandments. If you hunger and thirst after righteousness, you shall be filled. God trusts us to stand on the principles of holiness. We are the temple of God. At conversion, change is necessary. We must be set apart from the world in our dress, our conversation, our way of thinking, the places we go and the way we act—in every aspect of our life.

Yet Elisha's servant, Gehazi, ran after Naaman and lied to claim the money. He suffered a curse of getting Naaman's leprosy. We are all ministers in God's Kingdom. We all need to do our part. 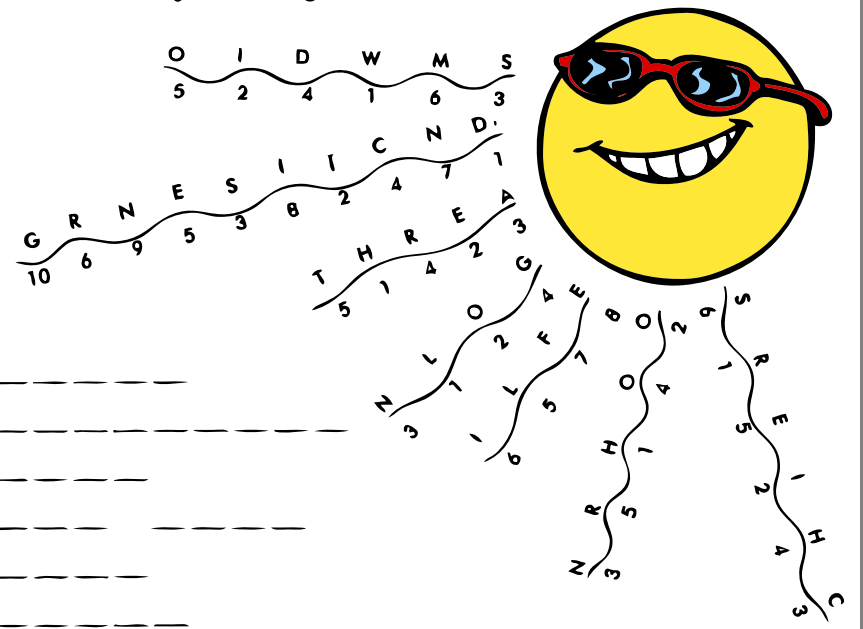

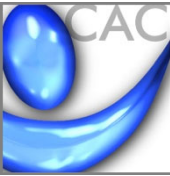
