Pastor Joseph preached "His Cruelest Pain & Greatest Joy" from Acts 17:30-31 & Hebrews 12:1-3. We cannot fully appreciate the good things in life unless we have suffered their opposite. Similarly, we can only begin understand the great joy the Lord Jesus apparently foresaw (as motivation for obeying unto death), by pondering what was the cruelest pain He endured. He "for the joy that was set before him endured the cross" (Hebrews 12:2). He suffered cruel, excruciating pain for all mankind. Yet His worst pain was emotional—even worse than the betrayal of Judas and His disciples abandoning Him. His greatest joy was foreseeing obedient souls. Contrasted with this, His emotional pain was foreseeing those who would never be saved, and—even worse—His cruelest pain was foreseeing those who would walk away after knowing the truth and being filled with the Spirit. Live for God so as not to bring pain to your pastor and to the Lord!

Pastor Joseph preached "The Seven Openings of Easter" from Matthew 27:45-60 & 28:1-6. The resurrection of The Lord Jesus Christ is without a doubt the most important aspect of our faith. It is proof that in, and through, Christ Jesus the man, God will judge the world in righteousness. There are at least seven amazing "openings" in the Gospel accounts surrounding his death, burial, and resurrection. The gates of the Holy City were opened. As Jesus entered Jerusalem, people cried, "Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord." The New Covenant was opened, allowing all flesh the chance to be born again of water and of the Spirit. Our Savior's side was opened, and blood and water flowed. This calls to mind that He is the Living Water and His precious blood redeems people from sin. The Holy of Holies was opened. As His body was torn for us, the veil in the Temple was torn from top to bottom, showing that there is no longer a barrier between us and God's mercy. The tomb of Jesus Christ was opened. He is risen! He has conquered death! More proof of this is that the graves of Old Testament saints were opened. Finally, the door of salvation was opened! Those who follow Jesus are spiritually resurrected with Him so that they may walk in a new way of life and receive salvation. It is essential for us to believe in the resurrection. It proves the deity of Christ. What do you need Him to open for you? Nothing is impossible for the Lord!!


Wednesday


