Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached a Mother's Day message from Philippians 4:5-7 titled "Balancing Act: Making Life Work with Brown Bananas." There is a motif in the Scriptures that calls for a balancing act. On one hand are verses that teach us to count the cost, plan carefully, budget for the future, work hard in the "on" season so we can eat well in the "off" season. We are advised to labor with our hands so we can have to eat and can have to give to them that are suffering. Yet on the other hand are verses encouraging us to trust God, don't fret or worry about what you will eat, or what you will wear, or how your needs will be met. Some of these admonitions come to us straight from the mouth of the Lord Jesus. So which is it? Work and prepare or relax and trust God? The answer, somehow, is both. There is actually a sweet spot right in the middle, in which we actually somehow do both. Godly mothers show moderation in various aspects of their daily lives, doing a balancing act between planning for the future while also trusting God to make up for where our own plans fall short. Noah had both faith in God and a solid work ethic. God wants us to trust Him and to work. Just a short time after God had saved the Israelites by parting the Red Sea they murmured against Him because they had no food. God provided quail and manna for them, but there was a work they had to do. They needed faith that God would provide every day, but they had to value the blessing and gather it carefully. Eventually, because of doubt, that first generation of freed Israelites (except Joshua and Caleb) was not allowed to enter the promised land. God is pleased to bless faithfulness and hard work. We must pray and balance various aspects of our lives so we can be pleasing to God.

Awesome service! There were healings, deliverance, anointing, and two souls were baptized in the name of Jesus. Pastor Joseph exhorted from Isaiah 61:1-3. We must stand for God and obey His commandments. The biggest battle we have is in our mind (thought life). We must take control of our thoughts, which is "bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (II Corinthians 10:5). We must live our life in an attitude of praise. God will give us "beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness" (Isaiah 61:3). We ought to praise God both when we feel like it and when we don't!

Elder Hannah Sandy preached "13 Volts To Evil" from Solomon 2:15. People start sinning a little at a time. Then as time passes their sins get bigger and bigger. 



Today is Pentecost Sunday! Seven weeks ago we celebrated the Resurrection of Jesus (which originally occurred on the Jewish Feast of Firstfruits), an event which is foundational to Christianity. However, also foundational is the subsequent outpouring of the Holy Ghost on the Jewish Feast of Pentecost, also called the Feast of Weeks. Pentecost is Greek for "the fiftieth," while in Hebrew, "Shavuot" mean "weeks." This feast day was originally a commemoration of the giving of the Law of Moses at Mt. Sinai, 50 days after the Feast of Firstfruits (see Exodus 34:22, Deuteronomy 16:10). However, Pentecost also became the birthday of the New Covenant Church (see Acts 2:1-4) in approx. 33 AD. That initial outpouring of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2 happened 50 days after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. (Whitsunday is another name used on some calendars because of the white garments worn by some who were baptized in a vigil during the holiday.) If you have not yet been baptized in the Holy Ghost as in Acts chapters 2, 8, 10, and 19, then today is your day to receive the Holy Spirit infilling!

On this day in 1948, Israel declared its independence and once again became a sovereign state! (Note: Although the event originally took place on May 15 on the Gregorian calendar, because Israel honors the Jewish calendar, this year the event was celebrated in Israel on May 12 on the Gregorian calendar.)
