Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached "Lost And Found" from Luke 15:18-24. Often overlooked is our posture toward the past. Many call themselves "progressive" and embrace the notion that everything in the past was wrong. Such people desire to ignore, or worse, outright oppose the precious godly values that their forefathers, parents, and grandparents stood for. Their dress, thoughts and actions are intentionally different from the past, and worse off for it being so. In Jesus' parable of *The Lost Son*, the younger son—the prodigal (wasteful) son—left his family and community and wasted all his inheritance. The further one gets from his father's loving care, the worse off he will be. He needs to look back with reverence and wonder, and return home as the younger son did. The bad attitude of the young son is common throughout our land today. The youth want to flee away from God and their parents, despise the precious standards that they have been taught. We must have hope that God can bring a healing to our land, and pray that the lost can be found.

Sunday PM

Pastor Joseph preached "Sign Me Up" from Deuteronomy 21:10-17, Genesis 25:23, 27-34 & I Kings 19:15-18. The Lord is able to use *you*. Our attitude should be "Sign me up." We should all seek to be effective and do great, powerful things in the Kingdom of God. We should remain faithful to God. "Blessed be the Lord, who daily loadeth us with benefits, even the God of our salvation, Selah" (Psalm 68:19). "Great peace have they which love thy law; and nothing shall offend them" (Psalm 119:165). We must tell the truth and stay in church. It pays each one of us to stay faithful to God. We have a heaven to gain and a hell to shun. Esau sold his birthright. He felt nothing for God's promise, but sold it to please his flesh. This resulted in God stating he loved Jacob but hated Esau. Instead of pleasing our flesh, we must have a spiritual ambition to do great things for God!

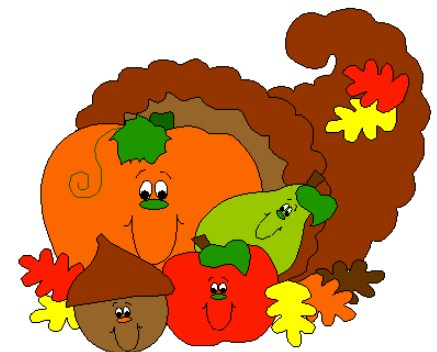

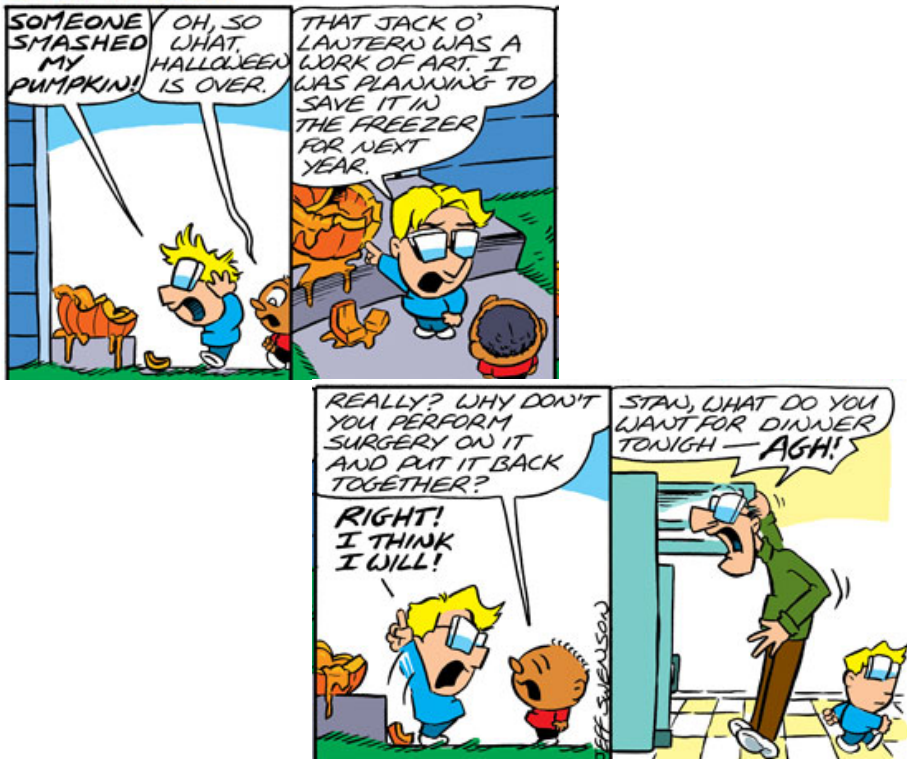

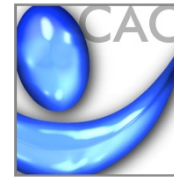

Caption note from Pastor Joseph: The above-left photo was taken at Ein Gedi, which is near Qumran, where we also visited. Both sites are near the Dead Sea and hold biblical significance.

The name Ein Gedi is composed of two Hebrew words: *ein* means "spring" and *gedi* means goat-kid. Ein Gedi thus means "kid spring" or "spring of the [mountain goat] kid." Ein Gedi is where David once hid in a cave from Saul. Saul happened to go into the same cave to take a nap, and David could have slain him there, but he only cut off a corner of Saul's garment. David later revealed this fact to Saul, at a distance, and Saul repented from chasing him and departed.

Qumran is where an ancient Jewish offshoot sect, the Essenes, once lived. The Essenes made scroll copies of the Jewish books of the Bible (all copies were handwritten back then) and kept them in jars. Many centuries later, the jars were discovered, and the excellent copies are now called the Dead Sea Scrolls. Later in our trip we visited the Shrine of the Book, an amazing museum where the actual Dead Sea Scrolls are kept. The museum also houses a display of portions of the famous Aleppo Codex, and a 1:50 scale model of the City of Jerusalem intended to show the city as it appeared in 66 AD, which was just after the time of Christ and before the Romans destroyed the Temple in 70 AD.

The above-right photo was taken at the Garden Tomb, one of two possible sites believed to likely be the location of Jesus' crucifixion and burial. The adjacent possible crucifixion site is known as Skull Hill (aka Gordon's Calvary, as it was discovered by a British man named Gordon). We also visited the other possible site, which is venerated by the Catholic and other orthodox churches. A large church exists on that location, known as the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.
