Elder Lorren Godwin preached "Obedience Pays Off" from I Kings 17:8. God takes care of those who are obedient to Him. The widow woman had only enough meal to made bread for herself and her son, but by faith in God she was obedient, and prepared their last meal for Elijah the prophet. One act of obedience sustained her for the rest of the drought. It is so important to listen and be obedient when God speaks.
