Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph preached "Wise Men Still Seek Him" from Matthew 2:1-2. The wise men, scholars from the east, were wealthy and well educated. They weren't Jews, but they had studied Daniel's prophecies and his Torah, and they knew that a King of the Jews was to be born. The wise men recognized the sign of the star, and were drawn to follow it. "There shall come a Star out of Jacob, and a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel" (Numbers 24:17). Jesus was born of the tribe of Judah. These wise men didn't know where they were going but followed the star by faith. When they found the child in a house, these men of great stature and authority bowed down and worshipped him. Wise people still seek after the truth of God's Word. We must diligently seek truth and be hungry for God. "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness; for they shall be filled" (Matthew 5:6). God will help a person who is truly hungry for His Word. We must completely give ourselves to God. Every man must encounter and seek God for himself.

While we need to remove ourselves from relationships that hinder us from loving God, still we must continually have love for God and others as our priority and guide all our thoughts, words, and actions by the love of God in our hearts.

A suggestion for parents: During your Christmas family devotion, just tell the story. Tell the story with faithfulness and respect. Tell it accurately and fully, bringing in the accounts of Matthew and Luke, drawing from the prophecies of old. Tell it with gusto and love. Tell the story of the birth of Jesus with all the excitement of someone hearing it for the first time. Tell the story without detouring into theories and guesses and myths and controversies. A Christmas devotion is probably not the time to conjecture on how planets may have aligned themselves into creating that wandering star which led the Magi to Bethlehem. Keep in mind that it "went before them until it came and stood over where the child was" (Matthew 2:9). (Try doing that with planets.) Stay on the subject. Avoid the history of Augustus' census and such like, unless you've found something worthwhile to bring up. Stay on the subject. Your Christmas devotion should not bother about non-biblical things. Tell the story with imagination and appreciation. Try to imagine how Mary must have felt, how Joseph must have felt, and how their families must have felt. Imagine how the shepherds must have felt, and how the citizens of Jerusalem must have felt when some foreign visitors show up asking, "Where is He who has been born king of the Jews?"
