Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph continued our Book of Acts survey, covering ch. 16 under the title "Terms of Departure." As Paul and Barnabas planned for their next missionary journey, there was a serious disagreement about whether to take Mark, who had previously bailed on them. The dispute was not solved, so they split up. Barnabas took Mark. Paul took Silas. (Later in Paul's life, he softened regarding Mark, asking for him to be brought in as he was "profitable" for the ministry.) Early in Paul's journey with Silas, they met and enlisted a young preacher, Timotheus (Timothy). Acts 16 provides more Bible commentary on cultural differences (a main topic of chapter 15): Paul, who had (in Acts 15) strongly advocated for not forcing Gentile believers to be circumcised, still had this young man. Timothy (later to be a recipient of epistles that bear his name) to be circumcised, so as to not hinder Timothy's options for reaching Jews with the gospel. Note: Timothy's parents were mixed (Greek father, Jewish mother). As Paul preached throughout the cities, he delivered the dictates of the council of Apostles/elders in Jerusalem, detailed in Acts 15. Along the way, many repented and were baptized. While in Philippi, Paul and Silas were wrongfully whipped and imprisoned. When God opened the prison doors by an earthquake, the jailer feared escape and was about to commit suicide. When he learned they were all present, he asked what to do to be saved. Paul gave an *emergency summary* ("believe...and thou shalt be saved"). However, Paul preached the full word of the Lord, and there is no valid reason to claim that the summary means that he did not go on to explain the need to repent, be baptized in Jesus name, and be filled with the Holy Ghost. The jailer went on to be baptized the very same night, along with his entire household! By morning the city's leaders wanted them released and gone from town, but Paul had some strong terms of departure: they were receive a formal apology and be escorted from town in honor. As a Roman citizen, he had rights. He didn't glory in it that, but utilized it to further the gospel. If we have any influence or status, we should do the same. Don't look down on people, but rather strive to establish a culture of love.

Pastor Joseph preached "Double Portion, Single Cross" from Genesis 48:10-22. We, as sinful humans, deserve being double-crossed (to be tricked or dishonestly betrayed or deceptively cheated) but God gives us blessings we don't deserve. God is good; all the time God is good. He came as a man and died on the cross to pay for mankind's sin. We should be so thankful for God's grace and mercy; for not double-crossing us but for giving us blessings. Jesus gives us mercy and showers of blessings. We can draw water out of the wells of salvation with joy. God wants to give unto this thirsty world mighty rivers of His Holy Ghost power. Jesus is looking for empty vessels that He can pour Himself into. God chose to not double-cross us, but to "single cross" us and pour out blessing! Come and be blessed!


