Sunday AM

Pastor Joseph taught on “Coerced Interdependence” from Romans 6:23. A pattern in Scripture reveals that the Lord desires to coerce mankind into interdependence on each other. We all need God, but by God’s choice, we also need each other. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus called for perfection (maturity) of His followers, which includes focusing on one’s own faults more than on faults of others. We are to discipline ourselves. Three areas of accountability are needed in our efforts toward perfection: accountability to God, to others, and to self. “Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world” (James 1:27). We, as the body of Christ, are accountable to each other. “Sin” means “to miss the mark” (i.e. fall short of perfection). “For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God” (Romans 3:23). There’s a difference between missing the bull’s eye and not even trying. In any attempt to render judgment on a saint, earthly saints are to work in concert with each other and with Heaven. God has always involved mankind in things relating to mankind. God used men to bring us His Word. The Messiah is God with us in the form of humanity—a God-anointed man, or God-man. God coerces us to depend on and help one another. He wants us to interact, to help, to bless, and strengthen each other. We can’t live without one another.

Sunday PM

Pastor Joseph preached “Tomorrow” from II Kings 7:1. God can use the least little thing in your circumstance to bring about a victory. Your situation may look bleak today but don’t go what your eyes see. God is able to do something tomorrow that is beyond what you can imagine. No matter how dark it’s looking today, we serve the true God who has control of tomorrow. When the miracle happens, we need to go tell somebody what God has done for us. Tomorrow has different meanings depending on your relationship with God. If you’re not right with God, tomorrow holds fearful judgment and fiery indignation and wrath from God. But if your life is right with God then you don’t have to be frightened about tomorrow, it holds a miracle. “For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end” (Jeremiah 29:11). Just trust God when your situation looks bad. He is in control!

Wednesday

Elder JT Sandy preached “The Numbing of the Vine” from Judges 13:3-4, 13-14, 24 & 16:4. Are the things of this world numbing us? The devil is out to get each one of us. We must follow closely after God. People get so caught up with the things of the world that they forget God. We should not hang around things that we are not supposed to partake of. Tolerance tends to lead to acceptance. Whatever you are tolerating in your life right now can eventually get a hold on you. We are called to be separate from the world.

Elder Lorren Godwin preached “This Beginning of Miracles” from John 2:6-11. Jesus can take something that is basically nothing and transform it into something. Let Jesus mold and make you as He wants to. We should allow Him to make us as He desires. We must allow God to totally transform us. Our primary focus should not be *what we can do*, but rather it should be *how we can please God*.

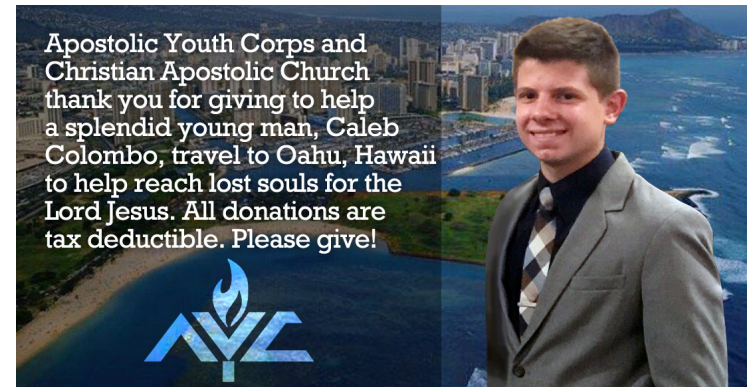
